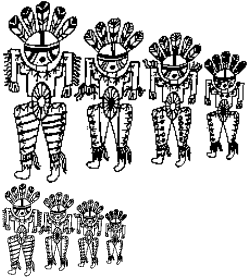
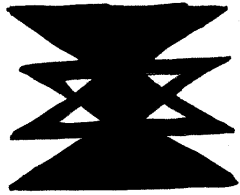


***PHILADELPHIA'S NATIONAL LIBERTY MUSEUM
